**The Last Supper** (Italian: Il Cenacolo [il t[e'na:kolo] or L'Ultima Cena ['lultima 't[e:na]) is a mural painting by the Italian <u>High Renaissance</u> artist <u>Leonardo da Vinci</u>, dated to c. 1495–1498. The painting represents the scene of the <u>Last Supper</u> of <u>Jesus</u> with the <u>Twelve Apostles</u>, as it is told in the <u>Gospel of John</u> – specifically the moment after <u>Jesus announces that one of his apostles will betray him</u>.<sup>[1]</sup> Its handling of space, mastery of perspective, treatment of motion and complex display of human emotion has made it one of the Western world's most recognizable paintings and
