April 15, 2023 (Tax Day)

DAY 15 PROMPT: Use the last line from one of your poems as the first line of this one.

Prompter's note: You can use the last line of any poem you've written, but it might be helpful to try this with a poem that doesn't quite feel fully finished. This is a great way to see what more that poem might be trying to say.

Craft tip: See how your poem changes when you adjust the line lengths. Try arranging your poem into very long lines, and then try very short lines. Then try using no line breaks at all (this will create a "block poem"). Notice how each of these choices can change the felt sense of the poem's meaning. This is because line breaks help to create narrative timing. It's similar to the way meaning is made through rhythm when we speak.
